# Order of action sheet (Dreamweaver)

#### To define a site:

First, on your Zip disk, create the folder where your website will live.

- 1. In the Site menu, click, Define Sites
- 2. In the dialog box, give your site a name.
- 3. In the dialog box, click on the folder to the right of the Local Root Folder and navigate to the folder where your website will live.
- 4. Click okay.
- 5. Dreamweaver will ask if you want to create a Cache. Say yes!
- 6. In the last dialog box, click done.

### To translate layers to table:

- 1. Modify..>
- 2. Layout ..>
- 3. Convert layers to table ..>

### To create a template:

- 1. Layout the template as you would like it to look.
- 2. Remember that if you lay it out in layers, you will need to convert to a table BEFORE you save it as a template.
- 3. When you have the file looking the way you want to save it as a regular html file as a backup.
- 4. Now save it as a Template: Go to File..>
- 5. Save as Template
- 6. The file is now a Template file, and you will have to mark a section or selection as editable.
- 7. Click on the table cell you want to be editable (Apple-click)
- 8. Go to Modify ..>
- 9. Templates ..>
- 10. Mark section as editable ..>
- 11. Save again.

#### Tips and Troubleshooting

- You can also make a selection (highlighting) editable in the same way.
- Remember that Template files will look something like this: template.dwt (.dwt stands for dreamweaver template)

- Remember to name your editable areas so that you can remember what you called them.
- You can't convert from layers to table (and vice versa) in a Template file.
- You can't mark a section/selection as editable until you have saved the file as a Template file.

## Using a Template File

You have two ways of doing this:

Most often you will want to start with a blank template (ie., the persistent navigation and consistent page elements are there, but not the content).

- 1. To do this, go to:
- 2. File ..> New from Template

Sometimes you will have pre-existing pages that you'd like to apply a template to.

- 1. To do this, open the file you want to alter.
- 2. Now, go to Windows ..>Templates
- 3. In the Templates palette, click on the template you want to apply (just once)
- 4. Now, in the Templates palette, click on the "Apply Template" button on the right side of the palette.

Note: If Dreamweaver says there is not a place to put all the elements of the original page, then choose your main content area.

## To publish using the Site window:

If you want to use Dreamweaver to send your files to the server, you will have to define the server information. This is done in a similar way:

- 1. In the Site menu, click, Define Sites
- 2. If you have already Defined your site, choose it from the dialog box, and click Edit.
- 3. On the left hand side of the site palette, click on Remote Info
- 4. Under the Access pull-down choose FTP
- 5. Under FTP Host type: panther.uwo.ca
- 6. Directory can stay blank, and you will fill in your uwo email username and password

Now, in the Site window, you will see an icon next to the pull-down menu that connects you to the server.

- You will be asked for your password.
- The "get" button will bring files down from the server
- The "put" button will send files from your disk to the server, just like fetch
