
Blueprint sample (partial, top level)

Here is a partial content map that goes with the blueprint above (which matches a course website similar to ours). You'll notice that sometimes more than one piece of discrete content will go on destination page. (That is a .htm page.)

You can also choose not to have any filenames, and produce a file structure with nothing but folders and index files. In such a case, the content would like this:

Remember to make your file names and folders as descriptive as possible. Say I had a website about guitars. The same few pages of content might look something like this:
