## The five elements - content

- The web is at heart a communications medium
  - Comms objectives
  - Content is what we communicate, usually we'll be talking about text
    - Not restricted to text:
      - Forms
      - Pictures
      - Database entries
      - Polls
      - Other media



### The five elements - content

- Text is the main concern
  - Is it written & formatted for the web?
  - Is it credible?
  - Text is also critical for search engines



## The five elements - design

- Aesthetically pleasing?
  - there is a difference between bad design and ugly
  - is it right for the audience?
  - Consistency in themes, metaphors?
    - same basic look on each page?
    - elements: logos, wordmarks, photos



### The five elements - design

- Colour -scheme, good contrasts
  - Typography -- text, fonts, typfaces
  - Tastes of the audience taken into consideration?
  - Does the design get in the way or help?
  - Good design <u>improves</u> communication.
  - Sometimes content and design are called "context" together



### The five elements - usability

#### site organization or architecture

- is the information presented in a coherent and easy-to-follow manner – does it make you think?
- does the site identify itself, and what you can do there?



## The five elements - usability

#### navigation

- is there more than one way to find your way around the site; does it help you form a "mental map"
- what happens when your users try to access info in a non-linear way?
- Navigation can be innovative and still work, but generally, we want to use <u>conventions</u>



# The five elements - usability

- speed
  - time required to display a page on the user's screen
  - dependant on: bandwidth, computer, connection, what is on the page
  - the more stuff you have on the page, the longer it takes
- reliability
  - does the site have any downtime?
  - does it download correctly?



# The five elements -usability

- platform/browser independence
  - how well can the site run on multiple platforms and browsers
  - degrade gracefully
  - media accessibility
    - are there barriers to accessing your site?
      -there are legal issues now
    - will it work with other devices: PDA, phones, etc



# The five elements - interactivity

### Or the four "c"s

- Customization
  - site customized by the company tailoring
  - site customized by the user personalization
  - popular with portal sites (less important now)
- Community
  - Chat rooms, listserves, message boards, etc.



# The five elements - interactivity

### Communications

- site-to-user (email)
- user-to-site (direct requests, forms, etc)
- server-to-user (see community)
- Commerce
  - are there opportunities for the sale of goods, products or services



## The five elements - technology

- is an appropriate level of technology used for the site's purpose?
  - I was torn where to link this, under technology or usability
  - Flash, Shockwave, Java, Visual Basic, CGI Scripts, etc.
  - Database or content management system?
